



Remembering us in your Will

Making a gift to Saltstone Caring in your Will is a tremendous way of helping us maintain our services to elderly and vulnerable people in the Kingsbridge area.

If you are thinking of benefiting Saltstone Caring in your Will, you should know that there are various ways of doing this.

1. You can leave the whole or a proportion of your estate after the other gifts and legacies in your Will have been given effect and the expenses or winding up your estate have been paid. This is called a **residuary gift**. The amount Saltstone Caring receives will depend on whether the size of your estate rises or falls.
2. You can leave a specific sum of money. This is called a **pecuniary legacy**. Unless you index-link the legacy, the sum will be fixed and its value to us as time goes by will fall with inflation.
3. You can leave us a particular item such as a piece of jewellery. This is called a **specific gift**. We would discourage you from using this method unless the item is very valuable such as a house. The item itself will be of no use to us, and the effort we must make to establish we are getting the best price may outweigh the benefit to us.

Suggested wording to take to your solicitor

For a residuary gift

"I GIVE the whole of my estate (or x% of the residue of my estate) to SALTSTONE CARING LIMITED of Room 9 Quay House Ilbert Road Kingsbridge Devon TQ7 1DZ Charity Registration No. 1119726 for its general charitable purposes and I declare that the receipt of a director or other proper officer of the said charity shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the said gift."

For a pecuniary legacy or specific gift

"I GIVE the sum of £x [or description of the item to be given] to SALTSTONE CARING LIMITED of Room 9 Quay House Ilbert Road Kingsbridge Devon TQ7 1DZ Charity Registration No. 1119726 for its general charitable purposes and I declare that the receipt of a director or other proper officer of the said charity shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the said gift."
